President Nick Firestone Remarks

Last year was another busy one for the museum: we hosted over 4000 guests and had 39 groups either tour the museum or use its facilities – including 3 uses of our new patio. We've provided meeting space for local groups such as EAA Chapter 729, Cummins and a small photography club. We have also hosted visits from church groups, senior living groups, local schools and home school groups.

2018 was a year of change:

We held a memorial service for John Walter in April in the airport's hanger.

To make the museum more recognizable, we added a sign to the outside of the building in May (see page 4).

In June, the Tom Vickers/John Walter Artifacts & Restoration building was dedicated and a sculpture honoring the 434th Troop Carrier Wing and Air Refueling Wing designed by John Walter was unveiled. We also added a new gallery where the old workshop and artifact storage area used to be.

In July, we had a memorial service for long time member Jim Peters in our chapel.

In September, we acquired a Wright Cyclone R-3350 cutaway radial engine which will be a working display in the museum soon.

Another future display will be a flight simulator.

In October, we had a wedding at the chapel.

In November, we made an addition to our Gallant Men wall.

We are embarking on an exciting new project for the museum and airport that will take a few years to complete and are looking forward to telling you more about it in a future mailing.

The museum will reopen for the 2019 season on Tuesday, March 5 and we hope you will pay us a visit.

The Atterbury-Bakalar Air Museum complex consists of the museum and William "Bruce" Dalton Media Center, the Jeanne Lewellen Norbeck Memorial Chapel and the Historical Markers on Bakalar Green. Bakalar Green is the preserved green area between the F-4 Phantom Jet static display and the airport rotating beacon.
